Application Process for Incoming QTEM Students	<ul> <li>After an acknowledgement-e-mail from TUM, students apply within our application period as mentioned on the <u>TUM Global &amp; Alumni website for incoming students</u>. Applications need to be done online. When completing the online form in the application tool, please follow the instructions on the first page of the form. Important: Online applications submitted after the application deadline will not be considered.</li> <li><b>The application process is as follows:</b> <ol> <li>A complete application must be done via the <u>online application portal</u>.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Necessary documents have to be uploaded.</li> </ul> <li><b>Required documents to be uploaded</b>: <ol> <li>One-page letter of motivation (either in English or German)</li> <li>Curriculum vitae (either in English or German)</li> <li>(preliminary) Learning Agreement / Study Plan (courses students want to attend at TUM)</li> <li>Transcript of records (all grades attained at home university)</li> </ol> </li> <li>Document listing the courses that students attend in their current semester (and therefore are not yet listed in the transcript).</li> <li>An official language certificate for English (C1 CEF) (and German (B2) if the student likes to follow German-taught courses). We also accept an official confirmation about the language level from the home university.</li>

## Estimated Costs of Living (in €)

Student Dormitories: Private Apartments:	280 € – 650 € per month 500 € – 1200 € per month
Food/Meals:	350 € per month
Public Transportation:	Semester Ticket (Deutschlandticket for students): 29.00 € per month (optional)
Academic Expenses:	Approx. 40 € per month
Personal Expenses:	150 € per month (according to individual needs)

Health Insurance:	Around 110 € per month (not for students with an EHIC card)
Enrollment Fee:	An administration fee of 85 € per semester (compulsory for all TUM students) – current status, the fee might change.

### **Visa Requirements/ Residence Permit Application**

Entry Regulations	Applicants from EU/EFTA countries and some other nations do not need a visa to study in Germany. Applicants from non-EU nations typically need a visa to study in Germany. To find out if they need a visa and how to apply, they must contact the embassy or consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany in their home country. Application processing times can vary greatly depending on the volume of applications and the applicant's home country. Submitting the complete application at least two months before the student's departure is recommended. <b>Please note:</b> Students cannot travel to Germany on a tourist visa since this cannot be changed into a student visa. Students in Germany on a tourist visa are not entitled to study there.

### **Health Insurance**

Are students required to get health insurance?	Health insurance is compulsory in Germany. Students cannot register at TUM without proof of German national insurance. To ensure that coverage is sufficient to meet German national standards, it is recommended that students purchase an in-country medical insurance plan. Travel insurances are not accepted.

### **Banking**

Must students open a bank account while studying in Munich?	It is highly advisable to open a bank account in Germany. German banks offer accounts free of charge for students. Debit cards from German banks are accepted throughout Europe.
What are acceptable credit cards in Munich?	In Munich, all major credit cards are accepted. However, not all stores take credit cards; in some shops, the customer is obligated to pay with cash. In smaller cities and towns outside of Munich, credit cards are not widely accepted.
